NorthEast High School GOALS

*At least 90% of 9th grade students will have 0 out-of-school suspensions
At least 50% of students will attend 95% of days or more. (No more than 15% of students will attend less than 85% of days)
At least 95% of 12th grade students will be on track for graduation
Increase proficiency of first time Keystone ELA test takers by 10%
At least 75% of 9th grade students will be on track to earn a minimum of 5 quality credits each marking period*
